

INDIGENOUS SCO STUDENT BURSARY: QUICK FACTS

The Safety Codes Council offers funding support for Indigenous safety codes officer students, including those applying with the support of a First Nations community, Metis Settlement, or Indigenous organization.

The Bursary is given in the form of credits towards a single level of certification. Individual awards can cover **up to 75% of certification costs** for the indicated level.



Applications are open February 1–July 31

Applying for the Bursary is a quick, simple process:

- Submit the current online application form or download and submit the print application form from safetycodes.ab.ca.
- Provide all additional documentation, including proof of entrance qualifications, before the application deadline.
- Communities and organizations who are supporting individual applicants are asked to complete a letter of support (suggested guidelines can be found on the Council website).

In order to be eligible for this award, the student must currently reside in Alberta. Applicants must fulfill the entrance qualifications for the discipline and level of certification they are looking to pursue with the help of the award.

Obtain SCO Certification

SCOs have the knowledge and training to provide front-line services in code interpretation and compliance monitoring. Training from the Safety Codes Council provides advanced knowledge of the requirements for the buildings and systems that they oversee.

Safety codes officers have rewarding and varied careers working for municipalities, corporations, and agencies. SCOs can also form their own inspections agencies or work to expand safety codes services within their communities.
